As Faculty Senate Secretary, I am charged weighing an accurate recoordwhat occurs at Faculty Senate meetings; I am also chargield drafting the Senategenda during Steering meetings. In keeping with my responsibility tosere an accurate record, I am writing to correct several misstatements in an email missive that our ulated to Senators by Senator Ausherman on Thursday, March 3, 2022.

- 1) I begin with Senator Ausherman's final sptien, "Why are we not allowed to keep minutes in steering?" The archival record speering consists of the final agenda for Senate, produced and voted on in that meet here is no Cleveland State precedent for keeping other minutes; the Faculty Ser between the substituting steering updating the Senate agenda in real time and so is in both simultaneously taking minutes of the Steering meeting itself. was not heard by the administrative assistably carny of the Senate officers. If there had been one "nay" vote inaudible one end of the room, it wild not have affected the outcome of the vote. The Senate officers believerefore, that the vote to reconsidier comply with Robert's Rules of Order.

Furthermore, at several points in the ting meeting on February 25, 2022, President Krebs made clear that any sterracould still bring any motion to Senate in New Business on March 2, 2022. No one did so, althoughrtheeting could certainly have extended past its 5:05 pm adjournment (as manthyer Senate meetings have done).

3) On the matter of secret ballots: per RobseRules, a secret ballot may occurrly if a motion for one is introduced and pasaesote. At Steering on February 25, 2022, Senator Ausherman put forth a motion for a selectallot for her motion to place an item on the Senate Agenda. That motion wasudised, voted on, and defeated. Therefore, there was no secret ballot, and her prepaired of paper were not used. As to why there was a secret ballot for the vote concerninglege reorganization under CSU 2.0 at the April 28, 2021 Senate meeting at ballot occurred because a motion was made and passed (by voice vote) for a secret ballot that April 28 vote during the March 31, 2021

- F. A vote taken April 28, 2021on the "General Acceptability of the College Reorganization Proposal in the CSU **D.O**cument," following 46 minutes of heated discussion with a result**Act**ceptable 25/ Unacceptable 19/ Abstain 5.
  - (The separate vote on the "Overadceptability of the Entire CSU 2.0 Document" came from a motion from a **vei**sity administrator at the April 12, 2021 Steering meeting, nobin a faculty member.)
- G. A special Zoom meeting (unpredented at Cleveland State) lelyfor the faculty of Faculty Senate at noon, ulary 12, 2022, to articulate concerns about shared governance in the CSU 2.0 process.
- H. A strongly worded Open Letter, dated January 19, 2022, written by the Senate President (with editorial input from the nate VP and Secretary) to Cleveland State's president and provost, reiterg ongoing concerns, articulated at the January 12, 2022 meeting, about shape dernance and a growing perception among faculty that all the hard work done by them during the pandemic, in keeping the primary function of struction going on without major disruption, was not being acknowledged the administration from the disrespect shown during the ontract negotiations.
- I. A Senate plan, conceived and repdrite by UFAC at the February 2 and March 2, 2022 Senate meetings, to allow senators and other faculty opportunity for input to UCC on the spific proposals for forming college structures, was distributed on March 20, with a final Senate consideration of the UCC summary report duetate April 27, 2022 Senate meeting.

As Senate President Krebs urged is Miarch 4, 2022 email to Senators: now is the time to offer "your concerns, yosunggestions, and your requests" for further Senate procedure "deliberatis" and "review" through the process now available to you.
