Dr. Schultz-Bergin explained that several modifiers were suggested by UCC and reviewed by Steering (involving urgent chges Juneteenth and Columbosy, made without Senate approval, which now require retroactive approval). This detail was approved by voice vote

Dr. Schultz-Bergin then referred to other **robes** still being discussed by UCC and Steering involving Columbus Day and the day before **Thes** giving, sought by students as a day off. He also raised the possibility changing the name of Conhous Day to Indigenous People's Day. He also referred to the imbalance between ber of teaching **da** in Fall and Spring (which could possibly be balanced to by snow days or a reading days).

Faculty from different departments and collegeeke about various contingent circumstances based on their curricula that would impate discussion. Following this discussion, two motions were introduced:

UCC introduced a Motion to recommend a chaingle Calendar to rename "Columbus Day" to Indigenous People's Day. This motion passed by voice vote

UCC introduced a Motion that Indigenous People'ay should alternate with Veteran's Day (Tu/Th / MWF), so that 2025 would echo 2021 is the tail on the 5-year calendar attached with the Senate agenda.

Brian Mickelbank made a motion for the academic calendar, going forward, seconded by Jim Marino:
