Article I. NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Black Faculty and Staff Organization **efacile** State University, hereinafter referred to atthe BFSO of CSU.

Article II. PREAMBLE

The purpose of the Constitution and Baylys is to provide the organizational structure for stability and accountability in the operation of the SO of CSU. The black faculty and staff are integral, though under represented members of the SU community. Article III . PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

Section A Purpose

The BFSO of CSU shall exist for the following purposes:

- 6. To serve as resource bureau of concerned black people for, Could lack community, and the general populace of Northeast Ohio;
- 7. To provide both leadership and other supportive service the madministrative and academic levels to facilitate delivery of efficient and effective service to all elements of the University.

Article IV . MEMBERSHIP OF THE ORGANIZATION

Section A Membership

The membership of the BFSO of CSU is opento all full-time and partime employees (faculty and contract and classified staff) who are financially in good standing whosupport the purpose and objectives the organization All such persons are eligibler for embership irrespective of the sition held at the University.

Section B Type of Membership

There shall be one type of membership; active members in financial good standing shall be entitled to one YRWH LQ WKH RUJDQL]DWL Referrings of the brogardization and whold both an in Ethev LQHVV organization.

Article V. OFFICERS OF THE ORGANIZATION

Section A Officers

The officers of the BFSOf CSUshall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurend Parliamentarian. The President Vice President shall be either faculty or staff members, respectively. If the president is a member of stalfideePresidentshall be a faculty membered vice versa.

- 1. All officers of the organization shall be teed upon by the active membership present at the electoral meeting.
- 2. The officers of the organization shall be elected by a majority vote of all votes cast by members in good standing.
- 3. Term of office shall be for two years. Officers may serve a maximum consecutive terms in the same office. In the event of a vacancy, the President shall appoint with three provides the executive committee a replacement serve the remainder of the term.

Section B:Duties of Officers

- 1. THE PRESIDENT: The Presidental hpreside at all meetings of the organization and shall be chairperson and preside at meetings of the Executive Committee. The President shall perform the duties as necessary to assure progress of the organization, especially:
 - a. To execute policy set by the organization and assume ultimate responsibility for executing decisions of the Executive Committee members or members present at a regular or call meeting
 - b. To serve as spokesperson of the organization;
 - c. To appoint members of all standing anehaod: committees;

d. To delegate responsibilities to each standing committee.

The President shall be an ex officio member of all committees.

- 2. THE VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shadder form duties of the President in his or her absence or incapacity of the Bidentandserve as the official link to the ivision of Institutional Diversity to keep BFSO apprised of its activities and ways that BFSO may interact his vitifice.
- THE RECORDING SECRETARY: The Recording Secretary shall be responsible for maigtaini accurate records and minutes of all general membership meetings and Executive Committee Meetings. The Recording Secretary, in conjunction with the President, shall prepare agendas for all general membership and Executive Committee meetagid.persorshall perform in the absence of the Corresponding Secretary.
- 4. THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: The *cesponding Secretary shall communicate*ting notices to all members before organization calls or schedules mediager she shall coordinate telephonecalls to members to give or obtain information for the President or the Executive Committee. He or she shall affix the seal and execute official legal documents of the organization. Said person shall perform in the absence of the Recording Secretary.
- 5. THE TREASURER: The Treasurer shall collect payment of dues, propose on an annual basis a budget for adoption by the body and make disbursements in accordance with the annual budget. The Treasurer shall also execute the duties essential to the disbursé forends cand to the maintenance of accurate and up to date fiscal records. The Treasurer shall report in writing the financial status of the organization to the President, general body, and Executive Board. The Treasurer shall also provide the general body it an annual report at the end of fiscal year.
- 6.
